



Since the October 7, 2023 attacks on Israel, Gov. Greg Abbott has directed the THGAAC to identify ways for Texans to report and take pre-emptive action against antisemitism. He has relied on the commission's guidance to develop targeted policies, including an executive order to keep college campuses safe for Jewish students.

And the THGAAC relies on its Friends to achieve that.

When it began its work in 2021, THGAAC was a pioneer, since inspiring similar commissions in other states. Its ongoing efforts include:

- A biennial Study on Antisemitism to the Legislature
- Partnerships with dozens of community groups and schools in every corner of Texas
- Ongoing meetings with and recommendations for top state leaders

The State of Texas graciously funds THGAAC with a core allocation to cover its operating and programming budget and a minimal amount for grants.

THGAAC relies on its FRIENDS to provide requested educational resource grants to groups throughout the Lone Star State.

OUR JURISDICTION ENDS AT THE BORDERS OF THE LONE STAR STATE, BUT OUR WORK HAS IMPACT FAR BEYOND

Many organizations fight antisemitism on the local, national, or international stages. Texas was the first state to have a public agency dedicated to this mission within its boundaries. We know many Texans support the Jewish community and Israel deeply. Others, sadly, will never overcome their own hate. We focus on the **MAJORITY IN THE MOVABLE MIDDLE** — some of whom have never met Jews in their communities — and raising their awareness about antisemitism, the Holocaust, and other genocides.
