For the first time in Texas, experts from [The Genocide Education Project](#), along with Texas descendants of Armenian Genocide survivors will present a comprehensive workshop for secondary social studies and English language arts teachers, including classroom applications for teaching the TEKS requirement for Armenian Genocide education. The SMU Human Rights Program will also provide teaching resources to help combat hatred and prejudice.

Workshop sessions will include:

- Definition and stages of genocide
- Genocide education pedagogy and “best practices”
- Historical background on the Armenian Genocide
- Genocide denial, its legacy and immediate implications in current human rights crises
- History of the Armenians in Texas

Held in Carrollton, TX, the workshop will include a tour of the spectacular St. Sarkis Armenian church complex, survivor testimonies, a traditional Armenian lunch, and a copy of the NY Times bestselling novel, [The Sandcastle Girls](#) by Chris Bohjalian.
